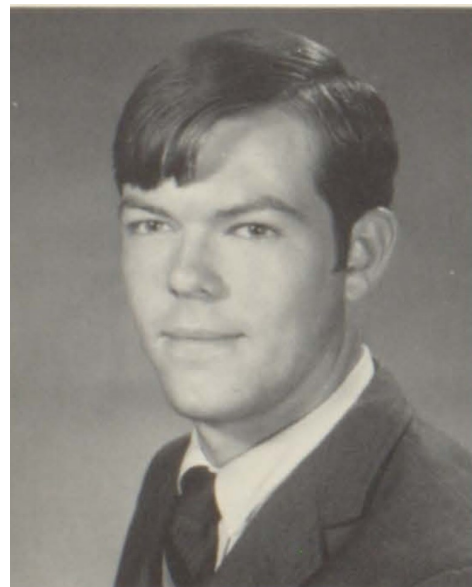

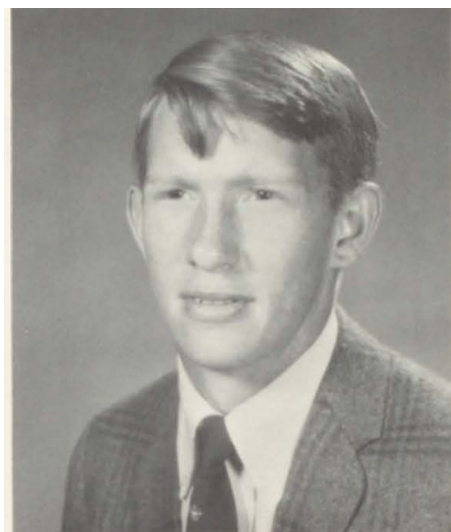

The Ice Bowl Became an Ice Palace for the Valdosta Wildcats

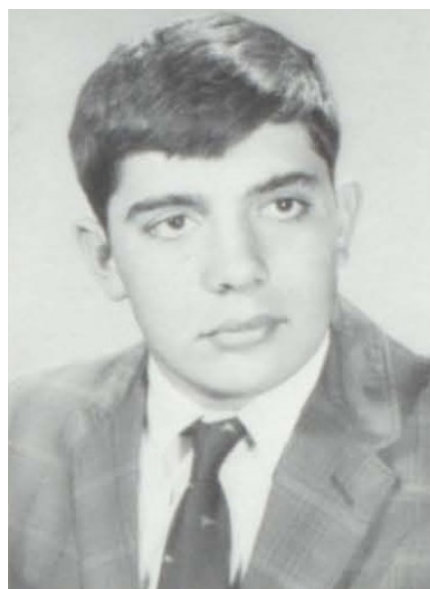

"There was now just one more to go, the state championship battle against the undefeated Forest Park Panthers in Atlanta, the site picked by the Georgia High School Association. [Grant Field at Georgia Tech]

The bottom dropped out of the weather. The temperature was down to 20 degrees. A 15 to 20 mile an hour wind whistled throughout the stadium. There were snow flurries.

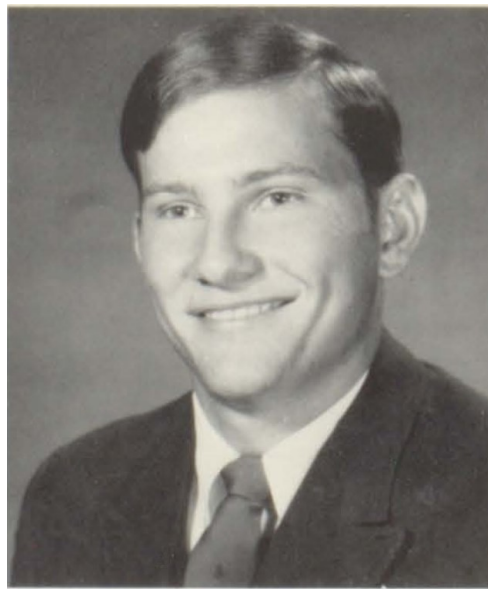
It was cold, so cold it hurt. But the Wildcats kept their football flame burning all the way to the frozen confines of Grant Field and gave Forest Park a 37-12 roasting.

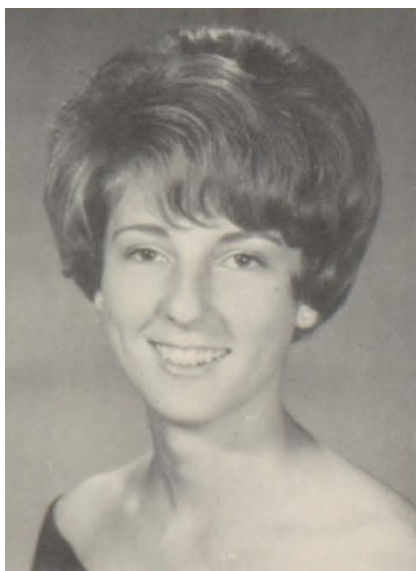

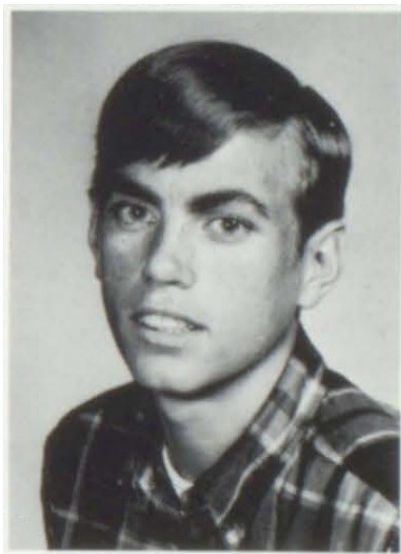
To the right, below and on the following page are VHS and VJHS classmates that did not graduate with our class from VHS.

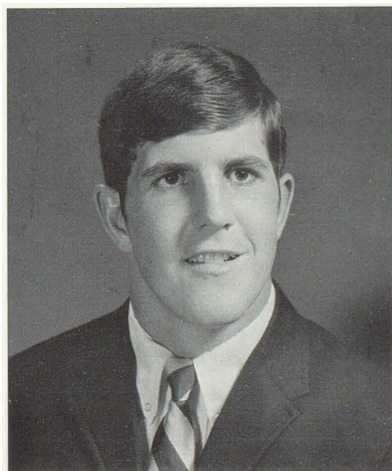

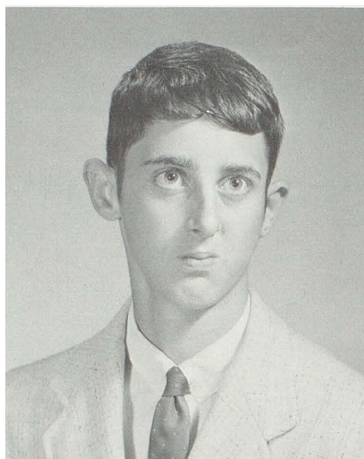


Above: Reflecting the Spirit of a town.

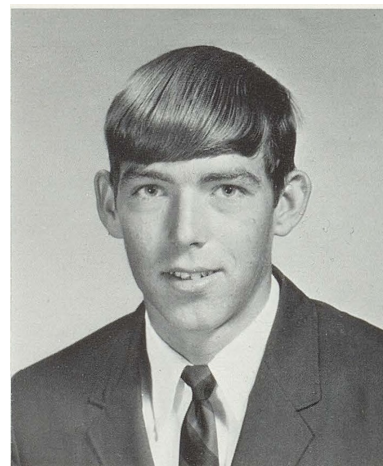
A bumper sticker showing Valdosta's slogan adopted in 1971 soon after our graduation.



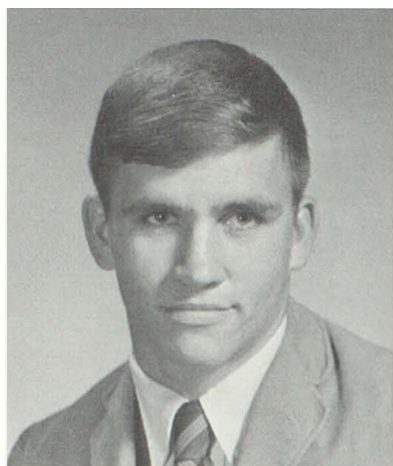

The 1885 Valdosta Institute and the 1905 Valdosta High School.

When the Valdosta City School System was established in the 1890s the Institute was purchased and became a public school. The 1905 VHS will be remembered best by our class as Central Elementary, most having attended there in the 5th grade, 1961-62. The Institute grounds were our P.E. area and playground, the building deconstructed in 1958.



Is ‘*Rah Bicca Bah*’ 100 ?

Three cheers and/or cheer stanzas stand out as VHS’s best known over the decades. In 1955 “**V-I-C-T-O-R-Y**” the Fight Song, the newer “**I’m so Glad I Go to VHS,**” and the early Dr. Cleveland’s “**Rah Bicca Bah.**”

We had no clue as to when Dr. A. G. Cleveland wrote his cheer until an opportune visit to Valdosta about 12 years ago. The vibrant 97 year old man had moved from Valdosta to Orlando in 1923 after attending the 8th grade at the 1922 Williams Street VHS the first year it opened. His story led us to figure the cheer was written in 1919 or 1920 soon after Dr. Cleveland arrived. The Class of 1949 lists it as “**Dr. Cleveland’s Yell.**”

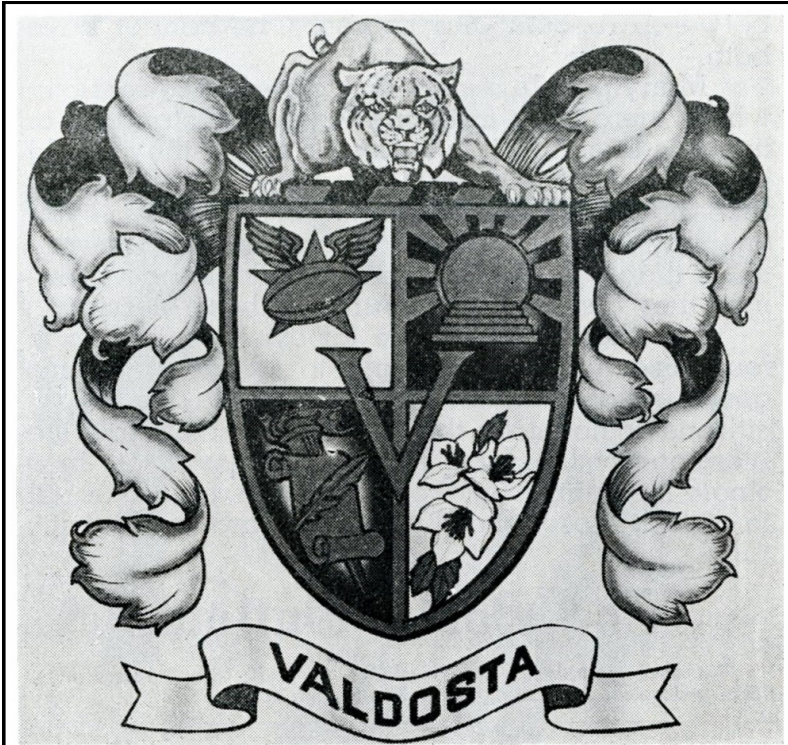
